ATTENDING CLUBS

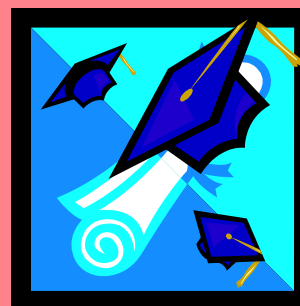
We still have spaces in drama (Yr 4- 6) and street dance(Yr 4-5). If your child is interested in either of these clubs, please inform the class teacher.

APPLE BREAD - Made by Apple Class

As part of their work on Traditional Tales, the children made Apple bread on Thursday (31.01.13.).

The ingredients we used were:

- warm water (Rudi)
- yeast (Abdiwahab)
- flour (Saja)
- oil (Gabriella)
- sugar (Joseph)
- salt (Shayne)

We put all the ingredients into a bowl and 'stirred the mixture' (Shemanto), until it formed into dough. 'The dough was squidgy,' (Samir) '...it felt like play dough!' (Kyrese) and '...it felt really soft.' (Trinity).

We made our bread into different shapes. 'I made a circle!' (Adam). 'I made Goldilocks' (Marwa) and Arlind made 'Daddy Bear'.

We cooked the bread. 'I shared my bread with my sister.' (Amira).

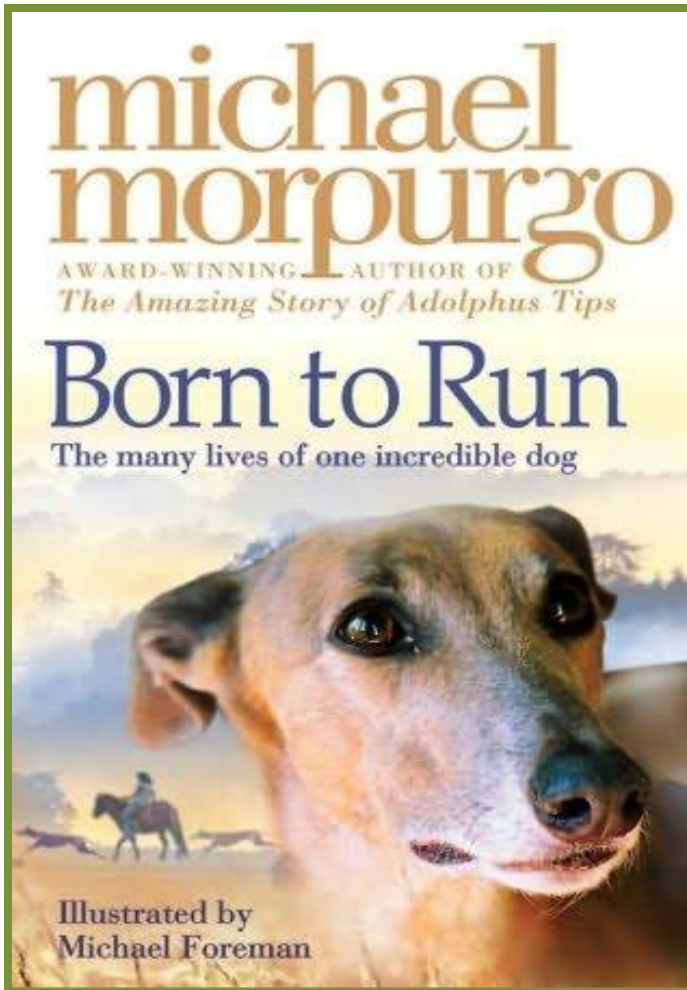


BOOKS WE RECOMMEND – Year 6

Who will he meet next?



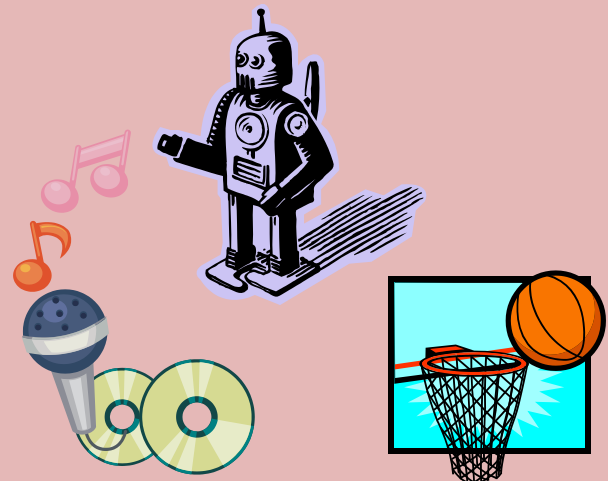
TALENT SHOW WINNERS

The winners were:-

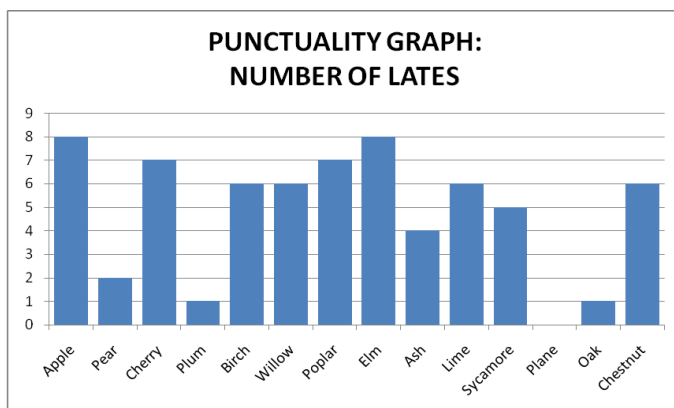
- 1st Prize. Krishna, Year 6 (Singing) Anderson House.

The winners received vouchers and house points, and all the children who took part were given a book, and house points.

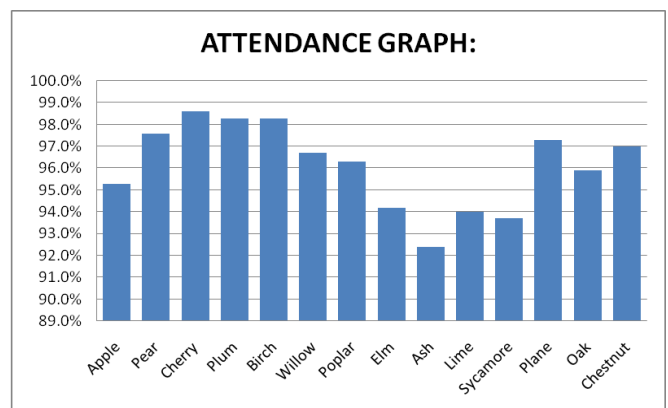


PUNCTUALITY AND ATTENDANCE GRAPHS
